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WALL MURAL

Have you been wondering about the beautiful mural that was done late last year?

It was done by Aboriginal artist Scott Rathman.

Scott visited our school mid-year and ran workshops with Year 4, 5 & 6 students. He used a process whereby students individually brainstormed what they thought made our school special before refining their lists to just a top few. Finally he asked them to think about ways they could convert their words into symbols or icons to convey their meaning. This last part proved very challenging for some but provided a great opportunity for others to unleash their creativity.


Scott took the students ideas away with him and used them as a basis to draw a unique design for our school. Later in the year Scott returned to school with a small team of helpers to bring the design to life on the outside wall of the hall. It took them two days and many, many cans of spray paint.

This is what Scott had to say about his artwork.

"The mural incorporates a number of elements reflecting moments along a student's journey through school. The sunrise represents the promise of a new beginning, reflecting each school day as a new beginning as we leave behind yesterday. The iconography within the design (left to right) represents teaching and learning, friendships and connections, students finding their individual voice and embracing, supporting and uplifting each other."



I'm sure you'll agree the mural is a fantastic addition to our school and it is well worth a visit to look at it up close to appreciate all the different elements it contains.

Dear parent/caregiver

For the second year, South Australian families with children attending public schools will receive a \$100 discount per student on their annual materials and services charge, delivering the government's two-year commitment made at the 2022 state election.

Approaching the start of the school year, we know cost-of-living pressures are being felt by many families and we hope this discount will provide some relief.

Unlike last year, you don't need to do anything to claim the \$100 discount. It will automatically be issued by your school.

The discount does not apply to families approved for school card as they are not required to pay the materials and services charge.

School card applications are now open for 2023. Income limits, based on the number of dependent children in your family, have been increased by 6.4% this year. With this increase, some families who were not previously eligible may now qualify. Information on school card eligibility, income limits and the application process can be found at: sa.gov.au/education/schoolcard.

If you are experiencing financial difficulty and require assistance paying the discounted materials and services charge, we encourage you to speak to your school as soon as possible. Support is available to those who need it, including the option of paying the charge by instalments.

As a compassionate response to the ongoing nature of the conflict in the Ukraine, Ukraine nationals arriving in Australia will continue to receive fee-free education in 2023 in South Australian public schools. Support will also continue to be provided to Afghan evacuees.
