## I AM READY TO GO BACK TO SCHOOL WHEN.....

I am free from fever for 24 hours without the assistance of Panadol or Nurofan	I have been free from vomiting & diarrhoea for 48 hours	I only have a clear runny nose & mild infrequent cough	I have had the appropriate lice treatment at home	I have had appropriate treatment and don't have any discharge from my eyes	I am free from rash, itching and fever and seen a Doctor if needed	I am back to my usual self, active and playful
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If your child has a bacterial infection, he/she should stay at home until the antibiotic has been given for at least 24 hours and your Doctor has given you permission for your child to return to school

We encourage you to seek medical attention if you have concerns about your child, and follow your Doctors recommendations about returning to school and other activities.

In the best interest of your child and the wider community, if your child is unwell keep them at home.
