Governing Council and staff would like to remind all families about the importance of our Dress Code Policy. It is expected that all students wear the recommended clothing at all times which ensures that all students have a sense of belonging to the school community, comfortable to participate in school activities, reflect our school values and creates a sense of equity for all.

Consequences for non-compliance

- A note, by the class teacher, will be sent home with the student notifying the parents/careers that their child failed to comply with the Dress Code Policy.
- Continued non compliance will result in parents/careers being contacted by the Leadership Team.
- For students who fail to comply with the Dress Code Policy on numerous occasions , a meeting will be set up with the Leadership Team and the parents/caregivers.
- If a student refuses to follow sections of the Dress Code Policy which falls under the Skin Protection and Hot Weather Policy and/or safety requirements they will be required to be in a shaded area or an alternative program will be offered for safety reasons.
- At play time any child who is not wearing a hat on a day where the UV level is 3 or above will need to sit under the shaded areas.

Tops  	Maroon or gold <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Polo Shirt/T –shirt Windcheater or jumper 2 toned maroon/gold hoodie Jacket Long sleeve t-shirt (black can be worn under a maroon or gold t-shirt) Black Waterproof jacket
Bottoms 	Black <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Shorts Skirts Pants Skorts
Dresses 	Maroon/red and white check
Hats 	Maroon Hats are to be worn all year round unless the UV level is below 3, when the whole school will be notified that wearing a hat is optional (likely only during term 2). <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Wide brimmed Hat, Legionnaires Hat, Legionnaires Hat
Beanie 	Black or maroon plain or with school logo can be worn on no hat days when UV rating is under 3 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> NO pompom
Shoes 	Suitable sturdy footwear <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Sneakers Plain black, navy or brown rubber soled shoes Enclosed sandals
Hair 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Neat and tidy Off the face Natural hair colour only Tied up if below the shoulders

Item	Guidelines
Accessories 	<p>Maroon, black or gold</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Hair ribbons • Hair ties • Headbands • Scarves • Headwear– for cultural reasons
Jewellery 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Studs • Sleepers • Watch • Medic alert bracelet
Make up 	<p>Not to be worn unless as part of a performance endorsed by the school.</p>
Nails 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Clear or natural nail polish only. • Nails to be groomed to a safe, practical length.
Casual Day 	<p>Casual days are held to support fundraising activities and special occasions.</p> <p>When students are wearing casual clothing it is expected to be within accordance with our Skin Protection and Hot Weather Policy and safety requirements allowing them to fully participate in the daily education activities.</p>
Seniors 	<p>In addition to the above senior students have an option of ordering a Commemorative Polo--shirt or jumper in term 1. These tops are personalized and list the names of all graduating students in that year.</p>

Dress Code does not include the following items.

As such they should NOT be worn to school:

- Different colours
- Clothing with writing or pictures
- Logos eg brand names larger than a 50 cent coin
- Graffited or damaged hats/clothing
- Mini skirts and brief shorts
- Midriff tops and tops that expose the shoulders
- Baseball cap
- Thongs, clogs, platform, slip on, ugg boots and high heeled shoes
- Make up unless endorsed by the school eg a performance
- Coloured nail polish
- Fake tattoos
- Writing on body
- Fashion jewellery—hoop and drop earrings, bracelets, rings, necklaces and jewellery associated with body piercing

All students are expected to abide by this ‘Dress Code Policy’ when attending school or going on excursions.

For exemptions for health, religious or cultural reasons, please contact one of the Leadership Team.

Some dress code items may be purchased through the front office. These items are good quality and reasonably priced.

Second hand items are available from the front office for a price of \$2 per item.

Please note:

- Parents/caregivers are not compelled to purchase garments through the school.
- Clothing should be clearly labelled, thus reducing the amount of unclaimed lost property.
