## FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Goal #1 in our School Improvement plan, is the development of our student's skills in reading. Some of the ways that we do this are by:

- Explicitly teaching students how to read
- Providing a balanced program which caters for different ability groups
- Collecting and using data to inform teacher practice
- Integrating literacy throughout the curriculum
- Effectively using technology to support all students to be successful
- Employing staff to provide reading support for identified students
- Providing many opportunities for students to develop their joy of reading
- Participating in the Premiers Reading challenge
- Providing ongoing high quality training and development for all staff

It would be appreciated if parents/caregivers could support their child's reading at home by listening to them read regularly and by promoting the Premier's Reading challenge. It is a great idea for parents/caregivers to talk to their child (ren) about the book that they are reading and ask questions about the book such as:

- Did you enjoy the book?
- Why did you choose the book?
- Who were the characters in this book?
- Who was the character that you liked the most?
- How would you describe this character?
- Was there anything about the book that you did not like? Why?

Goal #2 in our School Improvement plan, is the development of our student's skills in writing. In this edition of our school newsletter, Pod 3a has shared examples of character descriptions that they have written this term. Students have worked through a process to plan, draft and publish their writing.

Friday is Sports day. It will take a similar format as last year and conclude at lunchtime. As it is a school day, students are expected to stay with their groups for the entire period of sports day. In line with our sun smart policy, students are expected to wear hats all day. We also recommend that parents ensure that sunscreen is applied before school. Students are encouraged to dress up in house colours. Parents are most welcome to attend, but must ensure that they follow covid-19 protocols.

Finally a reminder that next week we are having our parent / teacher interviews. This is a great opportunity for parents/caregivers to find out how their child is progressing and discuss any issues.


He has two greenish teeth. He has a fat belly. He has a round nose. He feels rough. He has two eyes.
