FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Winter is well and truly upon us. During this time of year we generally see an increase in the number of students absent from school due to sickness. Please remember that if your child is unwell and unable to come to school that you need to phone the school and provide a reason of absence.

I would like to also remind families that we have an approved dress code at Ingle Farm East primary school that students are expected to wear all year around. It consists of:

- Tops – Maroon or gold Polo Shirt, Windcheater or jumper 2 toned maroon/ gold hoodie Jacket
- Long sleeve t-shirt black can be worn under a maroon or gold t-shirt
- Black Waterproof jackets are available from the school
- Bottoms - shorts, skirts, pants, skorts are black
- Dresses can be maroon and white check
- Hats - are maroon and either a wide brimmed , legionnaires or bucket hat. They are to be worn all year round unless the UV level is below 3
- Beanie - Black / maroon plain or with school logo worn on no hat days
- Shoes - must be suitable sturdy footwear e.g. sneakers, enclosed sandals, plain shoes
- Hair - must be neat and tidy, off the face
- Accessories – headbands hair ties, and headwear in school colours
- Jewellery – students are not to wear jewellery which is dangerous
- Make up - is not to be worn at school unless as part of a performance
- Nails - are to a safe practicable length. Clear or natural nail polish only

Ducks Make the World's Best Pets


I am 100% sure that ducks make the best pets. My reasons are that ducks are relatively small, are easy to take care of, and are very loyal.
