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FROM THE PRINCIPAL

To begin this edition of the newsletter, I would like to publicly acknowledge the fantastic work undertaken by our SSOs. Our support staff add so much value to our site and continue to work above and beyond expectations. As principal of Ingle Farm East primary school I feel privileged to have such an outstanding staff at our school.

Earlier in the term our boys' basketball took part in a knock out carnival as part. I would like to congratulate the boys for their efforts and thank Mr Bates for coaching the team.

This week we have been celebrating Book week with students engaging in a range of activities . Once again staff and students got into the spirit of the Book week dress up parade. On Friday we will conclude Book week with a whole school performance.

I have been concerned by the high levels of student absences from school this term. At Ingle Farm East Primary School we believe regular attendance to school plays a vital part of each child's success. It is important that students develop good habits of regular attendance at an early age to avoid missing out on fundamental learning and to ensure your child has the best possible start in life. As well as an education school attendance helps children develop social skills, such as friendship building, teamwork, communication skills and healthy self-esteem.

Parents/Caregivers can help to ensure that student`s attend school by;

- Providing information to the school that may assist in planning for the child's learning; for example, medical conditions, developmental milestones and family issues.
- Ensuring that their child attends school daily. punctually and on time (8:55am)
- Providing the school with an explanation whenever their child is absent via telephone/ text message on the day of the absence and / or followed up by a diary note on the student's return to school.
- Providing a medical certificate where appropriate for extended absences.
- Letting the school know if an extended absence is likely or if the school needs to arrange work for students via Google classroom etc.
- Working with the school on intervention strategies to improve attendance.

If you are having difficulties with getting your child to school, please contact the school.

Finally, a reminder that later on this term parents/caregivers will have the opportunity to discuss their child`s progress as part of our term three interviews. Bookings will once again be online.
